





# PARTNERSHIP WITH





Walden School's deep commitment to implementing diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives led to our partnership with Louisville's West End School (WES) in 2013. Since then, Walden has accepted a total of twelve students into the previous nine freshman classes. WES provides an extraordinary K-8 educational experience for its students who reside in the most economically-disadvantaged section of the city.

This all-boys school serves 99% students-of-color and provides a fully-funded, exceptional private-school education, including room and board. Walden and WES have much in common, including small classes, an intimate learning atmosphere, a structured supportive environment, and numerous enrichment programs, making Walden an excellent fit for WES graduates.

Funding for WES graduates has been secured primarily through Walden's absorption of tuition costs as part of its financial aid budget. In addition, each student has out-of-pocket expenses totaling about \$5,000 per year, which have been funded through various sources secured by Walden.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Walden graduating class is required to have a minimum of 24 credits and the curriculum is exclusively college preparatory. Walden's academic year is divided into two semesters. College courses are arranged in conjunction with Bellarmine University, Spalding University, University of Louisville, and Jefferson Community College. Students are also required to complete 60 hours of community service and a Capstone Service Project.
